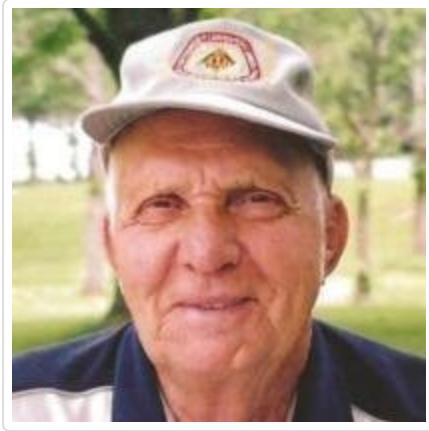




Mr. James Edward Covey Sr.

James “Jim” Covey Sr. passed away at 3:07 AM on Friday, February 3, 2012 at his home in Simpson, Illinois after an extended illness.

Jim Sr. was born on September 19, 1928 in Johnston City, Tennessee to author William Algee and Minnie Mae Covey and had attained the age of 83 years. He married Lillian (Crickett) Koehler on June 10, 1961 in McHenry, Illinois. Together they shared over 50 years of marriage.

He was a master carpenter by trade and a “mentor” and friend to many; spending much of his work experience building for Shawnee Enterprises of Marion, Illinois. He was a member of the Simpson Baptist Church where he shared the role of song leader and carried on the family legacy with his inspirational readings, poems and hymns. Mr. Covey served his country in the United States Air Force as well. Jim Sr. loved sharing his inspirational readings, many by memory, with family and friends and at churches across the country. He looked forward to weekend auctions, travelling with his family and attending annual family reunions. He was a family man and devoted his life to the Lord and his Church.
