Betty Rose, age 75 years, a former resident of rural Goreville, passed away Tuesday evening, April 20, 2021, at St. Sophia Health and Rehab Center in Florissant, Missouri.

Betty was born August 31, 1945 on the family farm northeast of Goreville. She was the daughter of Paul Lowery, Sr. and Mary Ann (Moore) Lowery.
