June 14, 1935 - August 2, 2018

Billy Ray Hutson, age 83 years, a resident of rural Stonefort (the Dykersburg community), passed away Thursday evening, August 2, 2018, at 9:44 PM at the Carrier Mills Nursing & Rehabilitation Center.

Billy Ray was born June 14, 1935 in the Dykersburg community. He was the youngest child born to Walter Ray and Eva (Arnold) Hutson.

On November 26, 1955, Billy Ray was united in marriage to Murl Dean Niblock in the Dykersburg community. She preceded him in death on April 29, 2018.

Billy Ray was a member of Indian Camp Missionary Baptist Church located in the Dykersburg community. He had also served as a church deacon for many years.

In his spare time, Billy Ray enjoyed sitting in his yard watching the hummingbirds. He was an avid St. Louis Cardinals Baseball fan.
