Marion also was involved in many ministries and activities of the church including mission projects to refurbish and restore homes in need of repair. His love of community service and willingness to always lend a helping hand to others led him to volunteer his time and skills with Habitat for Humanity. Additionally, Marion served for over 10 years as an auxiliary volunteer at Western Baptist Hospital until January 2010.
