Coy "Budd" Eugene Girtman was born November 1, 1946, in Cobden, Illinois, the son of Coy Girtman and Dorothy Mae (Little) Girtman, both of whom preceded him in death.

Budd proudly served his country in the United States Marine Corps for two years, including 13 months of service in Vietnam. His military service reflected his courage, dedication, and love of country, and he will be honored with military rites.

On September 7, 1968, he married his loving wife, Julia Kay Marshall in Lick Creek, Illinois. She survives.

Budd was employed by Dura Container of Herrin and then Pepsi-Cola, where he worked faithfully for a total of 33 years. Known for his strong work ethic and dependability, he took pride in providing for his family.

He was a devoted member of the Apostolic House of Worship in Marion,

faithfully attending since 1985.

Coy “Budd” Eugene Girtman passed away on February 4, 2026, with his beloved wife by his side.

He is survived by his wife, Julia Kay Girtman; his son, Timothy Coy Girtman; five grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Donna Jane Girtman Duty, and Judith Ann Girtman Bolinger.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three brothers, Howard Leon “Tom” Girtman, Charles Girtman, and Joe Girtman, and one sister, Ruth Maxine Girtman.

Coy “Budd” Eugene Girtman will be remembered for his service, dedication to family, and steadfast faith. His legacy will live on in the hearts of those who knew and loved him.
