Hayward earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Education and Business from Murray State University. He graduated in 1954. Hayward taught and coached for a year in Wisconsin. He then was employed by the Milwaukee County, Wisconsin government, where he served simultaneously as the Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation and the Assistant Director of the Milwaukee County Stadium. Later, Hayward served exclusively as the Assistant Director of the Milwaukee County Stadium.

Hayward was a parishioner of St. Robert Catholic Church in Shorewood, WI.

He was an avid outdoorsman and enjoyed fishing and gardening. In his retirement, Hayward and Virginia spent a number of years traveling and camping.
