Brenda J. “Jeanie” Ledbetter, age 66 years, a resident of rural Golconda and a former resident of Cypress, Illinois, passed away Wednesday evening, March 25, 2026, at 10:06 P.M. at her home.

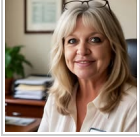
