Lottie Mae (Orange) Parker, age 89 years, a resident of rural Cypress, passed away Saturday morning, March 28, 2015, at 4:01 AM at her home.

Lottie was born February 23, 1926 in Cambridge, Kentucky. She was the daughter of John Spencer Orange and Minnie Lee (Vanhuser) Orange.
