Paul served 33 months overseas during World War II. He was a member of General Patton's secret weapon 443 anti-aircraft artillery automatic weapons battalion. Paul served in the European, African, and Middle Eastern Theaters of operation, with campaigns and battles in Algeria, French Morocco, Tunisia, the Sicilian Campaign, Naples-Foggia, Rome-Arno, Southern France, Rhineland, & Central Europe. Paul was awarded one silver star, 3 bronze battle stars, five overseas service bars, & a bronze arrowhead.

Paul was a former member of the Beggs-Gurley VFW Post in Vienna.

Paul was employed for 20 years as a mechanic at the Hood Motor Company in Vienna. He then worked for approx. 20 years as a Mental Health Technician at the Choate Mental Health Center in Anna, IL. Paul retired in 1981.

Paul was a faithful and devoted member of the Pulley's Mill United Pentecostal Church. Paul was an avid outdoorsman, especially enjoying hunting & fishing.

Paul enjoyed woodworking.
