Passed away Thursday afternoon, October 20, 2011, at 3 PM at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Marion, Illinois.

Lindell was born July 4, 1943 in Cypress, Illinois. He was the son of Theodore Cornelius Timmerman and Anna Elizabeth (Smith) Timmerman.

Lindell was united in marriage to Naoma J. (Funk) on July 8, 1988 in Paducah, Kentucky. She survives.

Lindell was preceded in death by his parents, Theodore C. Timmerman and Anna E. Timmerman-West; as well as a half-brother and a half-sister.

Lindell was a U.S. Army veteran. He was stationed in Germany and discharged with the rank of SP5.

Lindell was a heavy equipment mechanic and member of the International Union of Operating Engineers (I.U.O.E.) Local # 318. Lindell began his working career with Green Implement Co. in Cypress, IL later he was employed by Frank Nutty Construction Co. He worked for Southern Illinois Stone at Buncombe and then spent 18 ½ years working for AMAX Coal Co. in Marion. Lindell also worked for 9 ½ years at Vulcan Materials in the White Hill community.

Lindell was of the Baptist faith. He enjoyed woodworking. Lindell and Naoma were well known for their magnificent Christmas light display and decorations.

Funeral services will be held Sunday, October 23, 2011, at 2 PM at Bailey Funeral Home in Vienna.

Burial will be in the Cypress Masonic Cemetery. Military graveside rites will be accorded by the Beggs-Gurley VFW Post 5222 and the Illinois National Guard Burial Honors Detail.

Visitation will be from 11 AM – 2 PM Sunday at Bailey Funeral Home in Vienna.
