Salathiel Lass Quinn, 85 of Goreville IL, formerly of Du Quoin IL, passed away August 19th 2025 at his home surrounded by his loving family.

Salathiel was born in Du Quoin IL on November 14, 1939 at his family home. He was the son of Salathel Lassie & Mary (Story) Quinn. He was united in marriage to Nancy Louise Knapp on May 16th 1959 in Du Quoin. She preceded him in death on July 21st, 2024. Together they shared 65 years of marriage.
